


Mission

Key Challenges

- Navigating the care system is often challenging
- Care systems are often fragmented, work in silos
- Communication is often between the family & one provider rather than inter-disciplinary
- Family is put in the middle of collaboration between specialists
- Lack of coordination of care
- Overcoming the stigmas & myths of trachs





Inpatient Challenges:

- Decision-making vs. emergency
- Multiple services- Who's in charge?
- Caring for the whole patient: (communication, feeding, therapies)
- Emergency protocols












The ideal team: communication, collaboration & coordination
